Our History

The Rape Crisis Center was established as a 501(c)(3) in 1975 by a group of concerned community members and survivors who banded together to embark on a grassroots effort to address the needs of sexual violence victims, their families, and the community. The Rape Crisis Center is one of approximately 169 independent rape crisis centers (IRCC) left in the country. IRCCs are designed to offer services specifically for those who are affected by sexual violence, and due to their single issue focus, they are able to provide more comprehensive services, retain trauma resolution experts, and work simultaneously on mobilizing the community and preventing sexual violence from happening in the first place.

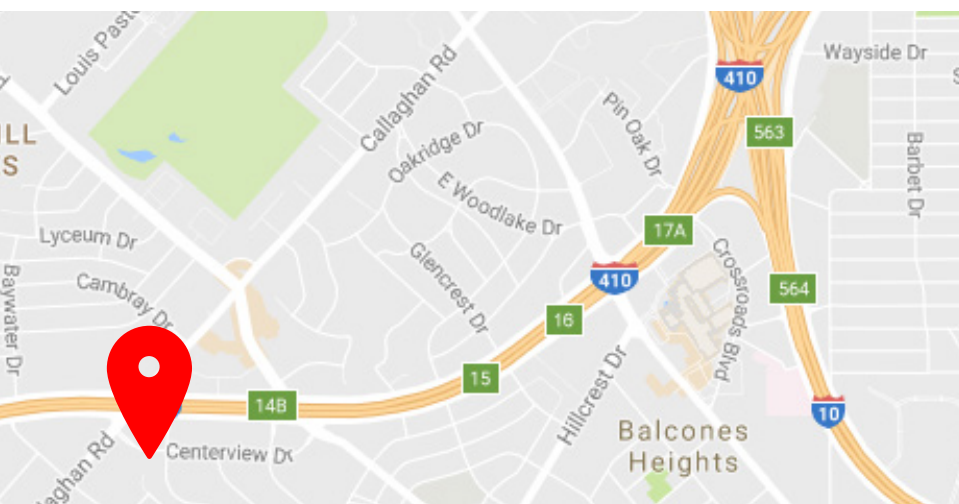

Stacey's Story

“I’m alive today because of The Rape Crisis Center hotline—because of Deana. I’m so grateful for her!”

In 2004, I inadvertently disclosed (drunkenly) to my father that I had been sexually assaulted. A week later, my mom made a counseling appointment for me at The Rape Crisis Center.

I would call the hotline for everything—like when I’d get out of class and just be having a terrible day, I’d call and check in with a hotline operator.

Knowing I had this number with me at all times to call (and the person on the

other end wasn’t going to judge me or ask “why were you drinking so much” or “why were you wearing that” and would never say I was blowing things out of proportion, acting irrational or that I need to get over it) was so vital to my healing. It was my lifeline.

But one night, I had painkillers (Oxycontin). I was done. I was tired of suffering.. I was going to kill myself.

That night, I called the hotline before I swallowed bottle of pills—Deana answered

the phone. She’s this very sweet and kind person who’s usually very calm, but this night she got angry.

She said, “No. You’re not going to do this. You’re not going to hurt yourself.” She told me they’ve taken much from me—and that was very true—but they weren’t going to get my life, too.

I’m alive today because of The Rape Crisis Center hotline—because of Deana. I’m so grateful for her! ■
